MESSAGE FROM DIRECTOR, **HERBIE BARNES**

"You are just a little person in a wide world after all". These kind words Gandalf shares with the hero, after all he has been through, resonate in my mind whenever I come to a road block in life. Like Bilbo we could all stay safe and comfortable in our homes and wait for the world to change, but we don't. You can't build a mass without many individuals. Gandalf the wizard may have all the magic, but even he is in need of a wee hobbit to save the world. *The Hobbit* is the start of the journey that culminates in the Lord of the Rings trilogy that amazed and entertained the film world, and we have tried to capture that here on the stage. The journey happens all around you. Everyone in the audience is part of the long journey the fourteen make to reclaim the stolen gold. The story reminds us that we, the everyday people, the small voices, the every man, woman, and child can make change. So when the wizard speaks of Bilbo being only a little person in a wide world, Bilbo is proud to say "thank goodness!"
