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

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

One of her most successful plays was a play developed with young people from Winnipeg and Norway House called Tangled Souls, which won a Governor General's Award. Her most recent development project is the new musical Hersteria, by Sharon Bajer which had its world premiere in 2011 and was nominated for the Best New Musical with the Playwright's Guild. Most recent directing includes Altar Boyz (WST & PTE), The Producers (RMTC), Little Shop of Horrors (PTE), The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee, Spring Awakening and My Mother's Lesbian Jewish Wiccan Wedding (WST). Kayla also teaches Musical Theatre and Acting at the University of Winnipeg Theatre and Film Department.

Brian Goldenberg - Artistic Producer

Brian is the founding Artistic Producer for Angelwalk Theatre. A two-time graduate of York University (BFA in Music, Schulich MBA) in Toronto, he works professionally as a theatre producer, music director, songwriter and performer. Brian is also the Artistic Producer for Vanier College Productions at York University, has worked as the Assistant Producer for Acting Up Stage Company (The Light In The Piazza, A New Brain, Edges) and as a business consultant for Dancap Productions. Brian has performed for many years on both piano and trumpet, and currently performs regularly with his Brass Quintet, Magnus Brass. As a songwriter, Brian won firstplace in an In Front Magazine Music Contest for his song "Music Will Always Lead Me Home", and wrote the music and additional lyrics for the Herbert H. Carnegie Future Aces Foundation Theme Song. His original musical, Seven of Us made its Toronto debut in the 2010 Toronto Fringe Festival. Brian is a recipient of the Herbert H. Carnegie Future Aces Citizenship Award (1999) and the Herbert H. Carnegie Future Aces Foundation Aces in Action Award (2010).

Brenda Gorlick - Choreographer Assistant Director Brenda has been involved in the Performing Arts world for over 35 years as performer, choreographer and director. Most recently, Ms. Gorlick choreographed Winnipeg Studio Theatre's production of My Mother's Lesbian Jewish Wiccan Wedding and won the prestigious SMD Foundation's "Dancing with Celebrities" Award for best performance alongside Gail Asper.
